





The Effect of a Bystander

There is a crowd of people all watching someone being bullied, yet no one steps in, and everyone just pretends not to notice.

What is a bystander? A bystander is someone who watches someone hurting, bullying, or just making fun of someone else and doesn't do anything about it, assuming it's not his business. However, an up stander will realize that it is his business and will get involved to help the victim in whichever way he can.

So why is it that when there is a crowd of people that see someone being bullied there is a less chance that someone will step in to help, when if there were fewer people watching, someone might do something? Bystanders are a very important part of our daily life. A bystander is a person who is watching a scene taking place. If the bystanders would have stood up and announced that they agreed with משה, then things would have been different, and the option to destroy the אידן wouldn't have occurred. Only after intense תפילה did Hashem change His mind, and the saved.

This is the power of bystanders and up standers. We can change a scene, and in some cases, save a person's life! It doesn't matter if one person is watching, or lots of people. Don't stop and think what others will think of you. Just be an up stander, have a lot of courage, and stand up for the right thing.
