Dear Parents.

LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Chanukah is a yom tov that focuses on children. The name Chanukah connotes *chinuch* and the Rebbe, in action and instruction, led rallies and instructed us to give Chanukah gelt daily in increasing measure. This is beyond what was previously practiced in Chabad: to give once on the fifth or sixth night.

This brings me to the central theme of the Chanukah break. From our perspective, the purpose of this break is to provide you with time to spend with your children. They really need you. While you sit around the menorah and gather at a *latkes ovent*, consider imparting to them how lucky we are to live freely and how to best utilize this freedom by living as Yidden learning Torah and serving Hashem with love.

Some fear that we may lose our freedom in areas of Jewish education and elsewhere. Let us reassure our children by focusing on today without causing them anxiety about a possible change in the future. Our children need reassurance, appreciation and guidance in what to do with the freedoms they have.

This newsletter shares with you, the parents, what has been happening at Cheder this year. We want you to be in the know about the improvements we've made in *chinuch*, and in what ways we are bolstering their *chassidishkeit* and connection to the Rebbe.

We welcome your comments and appreciate being in closer contact. We understand that the challenge of physical distance, and misinformation, may blur the facts of what happens at cheder day-to-day. If you are unsure about something, please reach out to the principals to inquire.

Enclosed you will find a series of useful nuggets of information and insights in areas we expect you to be curious about.

A big thank you to our *melamdim* for the last *tekufah*. You continue to stand by your talmidim day in and day out, committed to making every day a day of learning and *yiras shomaim*. Of the last five years, this term had the fewest staff absences. Our *melamdim* have dedicated their lives to the *chinuch* of our children and their dedication has translated into successful fruit and a fantastic yield of *yiras shomayim* and Torah learning.

Rabbi Shaw has been matzliach in establishing a great routine and a classroom from which the sound of Torah and tefillah pour out. The chassidishe atmosphere is palpable, and our talmidim are responding well.

Rabbi Weisberg

On short notice, Rabbi Weisberg stepped in to teach our fourth grade. The boys responded beautifully to Rabbi Weisberg's dynamic personality, talent, and scholarship. With a bright and lively kitah, under Rabbi Rabbi Weisberg's guidance, they are learning and davening beautifully. Rabbi Cohen's approach and demeanor have proven very effective and we see the fruits of his labor with talmidim more fluent and comfortable with the gemoro.
