During this rainy week, first grade made mini "u" umbrella crafts reinforcing the vowel u sound. In writing, we read a book about snow, then each boy cut out beautiful snowflakes (see pictures) and wrote about snowflakes. In math, after taking the summative assessment, we started a new chapter on related facts - how we can use the same three numbers to make four related facts with it. After many review activities this week using our vowel "u" we will IYH move on to adding another vowel next week. We are very excited to have almost completed our reader "Dig In". We were privileged to have an art lesson this week where the boys learned all about shapes, color and space. Then we continued to use this knowledge to draw beautiful Kosel wall pictures. The boys drew them, outlined them and then painted them with watercolor. Mrs. Jacobs taught the boys different techniques to use while painting. The finished products were beautiful. As we developed our theme on Winter, we listened to the read-aloud, "Sneezy the Snowman." He was shivering, so the children kindly offered their scarf and coat to keep him warm.
