Dear Parents.

This Shabbos we read shiras hayam, the spontaneous expression of gratitude and joy that the Yidden felt after the nes at Yam Suf. The Rebbe teaches us to take a lesson from every part of Torah, what lesson can we apply to ourselves, who are living in golus from the moment of glory at Yam Suf.

There is an emphasis today on pleasantness, gratitude, and gentle communication. There is an expectation that we constantly provide our children with a daily experience of hugs, gentleness, glee and celebration.

The Torah teaches us that there are occasional moments in which we experience jubilation and spontaneously raise our voice to Hashem in celebration. These moments have the power to carry us forward for many years and inspire us to serve Hashem with joy that is appropriate for everyday living.

Setting an expectation for our children that everyday be as stimulating and entertaining as the day the Yidden sang az yashir reduces their capacity to apply themselves with tenacity to learning. Learning requires toil. Torah should necessarily be a yolk. This is the primary area of lack that our Rebbies and educators are confronted with. This is what stands in the way of our children's success in learning.

The gift of grit is that modern-day rare commodity which you can gift your children as they prepare to receive the Torah in next week's parshah. Wishing you a good Shabbos,

We finished this chapter of subtraction strategies in math and next week will IYH move on to the next one. We were privileged to have art this week where the boys made beautiful scenes of krias yam suf using tempera paints. The boys learned how to draw birds and the water using the concepts of shapes. At the end of our unit in math, we practiced using the "CUBES" method for problem solving.
