Dear Parents,

Thank you for visiting Cheder this week. The clean building, the organized classrooms and our personable and dedicated staff, were all poised to welcome you into the setting in which your child spends many hours of his day, davening, learning, playing, eating and socializing with his friends. The cheder is the classroom and the lab where Torah values are taught and lived. And we hope you appreciated the glimpse into your child's life. Your visit was felt for days before you came. The children anticipated your visit and knowing that you will speak to their Rebbi and teacher increased their attentiveness and responsiveness to the lessons and instructions. Occasionally, a child may be overwhelmed by an academic milestone. A Child may struggle with a new subject, i.e. gemoro, or Rashi letters. They may bring their frustration to you asking that you negotiate down on their behalf. They may request an adjusted expectation to be agreed upon the two of you. Please keep in mind that our dedicated staff know your child, and Cheder expectations are adjusted to match your child's ability and are age appropriate and within the common expectations for a boy your son's age. If you support a child avoiding responsibility, when they consider difficult, you may unsettle the balance of responsibility and setback your child's educational, behavioral and attitudinal growth to a place from where it is difficult to return. Responsibility is a blessing. Being responsible for ourselves, and accountable for our actions is the right way to live. In the first perek of Tanya, the Alter Rebbe presents the extent of responsibility we have for every action, and the extreme value of every minute. This week, in perek chof tes, we read about the lasting impact of careless conduct of youth on our entire lives. Please partner with us to bring out the best in our children, to raise the bar with care and consideration and to keep our children motivated to step up with the willingness of a nediv lev. In English Language Arts our first graders learned about compound words like laptop, cannot, into etc. After writing the words in our notebooks we divided the words into two smaller words for reading. In Script we learned the letters "L", "E", "T" and "I". The highlight of the week (other than the Siyum) was STEM class with Dr. Shnitzel. A fun time was had by all!
