## FROM *the* MENAHEL

Dear Parents,

Today is the Yahrzeit of the Rebbe Rashab, founder of T"t and the progenitor of the title TOMIM.

This week, we will celebrate our Rebbe's birthday. Let's take a look at a sicha about this week's parshah, in which the Rebbe speaks about the relationship of the Nosi and the people. One of the pesukim in this week's parshah begin with the word asher, an odd word for an opening of a posuk. Rashi explains, that in this instance asher is to be understood as ashrei how fortunate. How fortunate is a generation in which its leader is humble and seeks forgiveness for his mistakes. The Rebbe shines a light on Rashi's commentary explaining it this way: how lucky are all the people of the generation who are fortunate to learn by example from such a special leader. The Rebbe's care for every Jew, doesn't only make the Rebbe special, it is the gift that the Rebbe gives each of his chassidim who strive to live by the Rebbe's example. This is the true celebration of Yud Aleph Nissan for our children. We want our children to not only stand in awe of the Rebbe, but to redesign themselves based on the life-lessons we encounter in every area of life in which the Rebbe teaches us how to live a nobler life. Learning Torah is the central mission of our lives, giving out shmurah matzah, inviting a less fortunate Yid to our Seder-Table, are a few of the current areas on which the Rebbe's personal example and gift impact our talmidim. This week, the shluchim gathered the information for all the Baal Peh prizes the talmidim earned in honor of the Rebbe's birthday.
