This Shabbos we read parshiyos, Tazria and Metzoro. The halochos, mitzvos and topics of both parshiyos speak about the impurity and weakness that are part of the human condition. The laws of impurity include many forms of tumah; from those resulted by the cheit Etz HaDaas, to those caused by lashon horo. Every Yid, man, woman o<mark>r</mark> child can become impure. All our material possessions, food, clothing, home and even the earth can be impure, each with their own causes and conditions.

During this time of year, we also mark the passing of the twenty four thousand students of Rabbi Akiva. In addition to limiting sources of joy, we take to heart the lessons from this tragic event, which include the critical importance of respecting our differences and one another. Even grea<mark>t</mark> people, learned and scholarly men whose occupation is Torah study, may fall short in the area of respect. Their Torah learning and piety may even contribute to their misguided disdain for others.

At cheder, we focus on Ahavas Yisroel year-round. Having many boys spend their days together, demands frequent reminders, talks and fresh insights into Ahavas Yisroel. The themes of this time of year make it easier to reach the heart of our children, bringing home the message about the importance of respecting others.

Please ask your children to share something they may have learned about Ahavas Yisroel this week. Discussing it at home will help instill this foundational value in the heart o<mark>f</mark> our children. Thank you Rabbi Shusterman for coordinating a gift of wine to the melamdim for Pesach.
