In our PAF literacy program we explored reading multisyllabic words by dividing each word into VCCV- finding the vowels and dividing the words by the consonants ex. Pic/nic, tun/nel. We listened to a Read-Aloud. "The Girl Who Never Made Mistakes". Beatrice was perfect in everyway, until one day she participated in a juggling contest and lost, due to her own mistake. Mrs. Sobol enlightened us by sharing what happens with the food we eat as it moves along our digestive system.
