We have been very busy in Grade 1B BH! In our PAF reading curriculum we learned the syllable division of words with VCCV (vowel, consonant, consonant vowel). We learned when to add the suffix es and s to words to make them plural. As well as learning to read words that end in nt, nd and lf. BH the boys are becoming excellent readers. Our first grade boys love to do math! The boys are now adding and subtracting two digit numbers! This week we had a nutrition class with Mrs. Sobol. We learned all about reading food labels and the sugar content in the snacks and food we eat. We measured out how many teaspoons of sugar are in an individual bottle of sprite! We also had an art lesson with Mrs. Jacobs where the boys learned how to draw surprise present boxes. When you open it up you find all the beautiful presents Hashem gave us!
