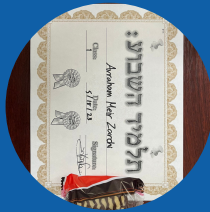
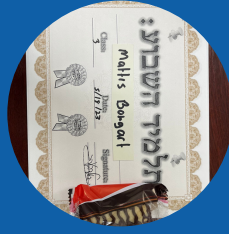

This week was packed with extracurricular activities in addition to our regular schedule. On Monday we began learning "long multiplication"! Some boys have caught on quickly, while others are still working on understanding the logic behind this math. In Reading we have been reading passages on simple machines such as planes, pulleys, and axles and wheels. On Monday, Mrs. Eckstein assigned the Inventor's Report (due IY"H Wednesday, June 1st). In addition, on Tuesday she brought in Tinker Toys to have the boys try to create their own simple machines. One group of boys made a space rover/time machine, using the concept of axles and wheels. A second group of boys made a car/tank. They not only used axles and wheels, but a pulley system as well. Please see the enclosed pictures! On Wednesday Mrs. Jacobs used the theme of Shavuot to teach the boys how to make foldable pictures and cards. On Thursday we were treated to a lesson by Mrs. Sobol on the Nervous System. She demonstrated voluntary and nonvoluntary reflexes and had the boys jumping and raising their voices. A fun time was had by all. Please ensure the last few weeks of school that your son has adequate school supplies such as pencils.
