FROM the MENAHEL

Dear Parents.

What's in a name? The parshah of this week is Nasso. Nasso means to lift up. Our mission is to lift up thet Yidden who Hashem places in our path. How do we do that? What lessons are there in the parshah that instruct us on how to lift up others?

The words נשא את ראש teach us that when trying to lift someone up, we need to give them something higher to live for. When we meet a struggling child, we want to make sure that they have eaten, are well rested and free of fear. However, we must remember that our purpose is נשיאת ראש to lift up their heads, to direct them to a higher purpose and to give them a higher vision and aspiration in ruchniyus. We must remember that the neshomoh is in the ראש and this is what we are charged with uplifting.

Another thing to look at is how to approach and deal with negativity. There is plenty of negativity around us. From feeling sick by a virus, to someone in our class who gets on our nerves, our efforts should always focus on the reason Hashem placed those things in our lives. It is the lack of, the pain of loss and missing something is there for us to lift ourselves up to a higher level. The natural state of many is to think about the obstacles in their lives and be upset and angry about how they disturb us and get in the way from us living our imagined idyllic life. The instruction to us, as presented in chassidus, about the challenge is to remember that Hashem placed these things there to serve as stepping stones that will force us to grow.

The growth that will come about will be a ruchniyusdike growth. We won't become more popular, famous or wealthy through this avodah, our neshomoh will become more powerful, not our body or yetzer horo.

Every person can apply these principles to their personal set of circumstances. Our children have one type of grievance, adults have another set and each field and position has its area of work. Hashem places these opportunities in our path to serve as rungs in the ladder of our neshomos revelation and growth. As we approach the end of year, which often presents, children who are more restless and adults who are less patient, let us remember that these circumstances are opportunities for creating a unique bond with our children, with our students and with our own connection to Hashem.
