FROM the MENAHEL

Dear Parents.

Wow. It is Shabbos Bereishis! The Rebbeim have ingrained in us that the way we set ourselves up Shabbos Breishis impacts the entire coming year. This is a call to us to reflect on how we should set up our Shabbos Bereishis? In what direction are we looking to orient ourselves for the entire year? How do we maximize the opportunity given us on Shabbos Bereishis? Chassidus teaches us that teva, the default position of the world and of human beings, is to focus on self preservation and to be unapologetically selfish. Focusing on others and Hashem is a teva sheni, something that must be taught, learned and practiced. In the context of Shabbos Bereishis, this means that if we don't reflect and set a goal, our natural orientation will be to focus on selfish and self-serving things and set up the year that way chas veshalom. We should keep in mind that self-serving truly means self-destructing.

How can we orient our children to be teachable and to absorb the messages of Torah and chassidus? How can we help them orient themselves to live with purpose and a focus on helping others? This week's parshah tells us that the purpose of our creation is leovdoh uleshomroh, laasos ulesaken. We are charged to fix a broken world. This includes ourselves, our yetser horoh and natural tendencies.

At cheder, we work hard to present every talmid with Torah values. These values often resonate with our students, which is great. However, there are times when what they hear and learn isn't a natural fit, it doesn't seem right to them initially. What do we do then? As parents, you provide your children with the perspective and understanding of how to approach new lessons and paradigms that Torah teachers and offers to each of us to improve our lives. Please encourage your children on this Shabbos Bereishis to be open to learning and applying new ideas, Torah values that may not be their default view. This orientation will set them up for an entire year filled with Learning and living Torah.

Please encourage your children to recite tehilim this Shabbos and send them back with a note sharing what they said. Our minds and hearts are overflowing with feelings for our brothers and sisters in Eretz Yisroel, our focus has been to channel these emotions to learn and daven with more intensity. On Shabbos, you can direct this energy to intensify davening and the recitation of Tehilim.
