One of the historical anecdotes about this week's parshah, from the early days of chassidus, is that Chassidim would do everything they could to be called up to the Torah for the first aliyah of Parshas Bo. What is so special about the first Aliyah? In the beginning of the Parshah, when Hashem tells Moshe to go to Pharoh, instead of saying 'lech', go, Hashem says 'bo' come to Pharoh, meaning the two of us, together, will go confront the challenges you face. Yes, to be a chossid is to remember at all times that Hashem's providence is there in every step and breath of our life.

This can also be applied to our relationship with the Rebbe and the relationship of this week's parshah with Yud Shevat the day the day when the Rebbe assumed the leadership of our generation.
