#### Dear Parents,

At Cheder Chabad the language of learning is English. The reason for this is that Torah should be taught in the way that it will be best understood. In the Chassidishe parsha of this week, the Alter Rebbe explains that Tanaaim and Amoraim spoke in the language of the localities where they lived so that they would elevate the world with its language.

In the winter of 5748, the Rebbe added that Chabad Chassidus requires us to understand Torah with our entire being, our nefesh habehamis should also understand it. He added that the Frierdiker Rebbe began teaching chassidus in the local languages so that chassidus would be best absorbed.

Dovid Hamelech compared the Torah to ingested bread. In order for food to benefit us it must be properly digested. One who learns words of Torah without fully grasping them is preventing his neshama from gaining the full nourishment Torah offers.

This is especially true in this age of enlightenment. G-d forbid, our children have a better grasp of worldly things than Torah because we presented them with Torah in an unfamiliar language.

In the language of this weeks parshah, "tosim lifneihem" we are charged to present Torah to our children like a set table fully prepared and ready to be properly absorbed and ingested.

We were even able to play Division Bingo this week! The boys have really been honing their Math Skills in Multiplication and Division! In Science we completed the Unit of the Five Senses. Mrs. Eckstein brought different items to class and had some boys describe how the items FEEL. We are also starting to get acquainted with division. In our five senses, we covered the fascinating sense of smell.
