

This week in the Adar spirit we decorated popcorn cones and crunchy popcorn was enjoyed by all!

In our paf program we learnt about the long vowel sound in two letter words- words that have vowels e and o say their names at the end of these common two letter words; we, be, so go. We also learnt about the Ch sound in words like; rich chip and the nch sound in words like lunch, bench and ranch. In math we learnt place value with tens and ones. We practiced showing 2 different ways how to combine tens and ones. Each boy received colorful place value blocks with sticks of tens and ones and then wrote in the answers for our math examples in the book.

Especially in regards to plural and singular. While some words just get an s/es, some become new words (mice, children, loaves) and others don't change at all (deer, fish...). We are continuing to move ahead with our cursive. The letter G is a 3 step letter that takes a bit longer to master. We practice our handwriting carefully as we relax with calm background music. Don't forget to ask us about the funny book we read. It was about appropriate etiquette and behaviors called "What if Everybody Did That" We laughed out loud but it also made us think.
