The week's Parshah, Kedoshim, begins with a mitzva which we recite thrice a day in the third section of shema "vehiyisem kedoshim" you should be holy. The Alter Rebbe explains that there is a mitzvas asei to refrain from permissible things (Tanya ch. 27, 29, 30).

Years ago, this mitzva was the embodiment of a Chabad chossid. There are endless stories of chassidim expressing how they internalized and lived this value. The Alter Rebbe's chassidim didn't go to Yechidus before they lived this principal. There are many contributing factors that have pushed away this identifying mark of chabad chassidim, between hunger years, the posh American lifestyle, a culture of choice, the art of iskafya, the insignia of a chossid has almost disappeared. This week, marking 28 Nissan, the day the Rebbe declared "tut alts vos ihr kent", our talmidim courageously gave of their recess to daven to Hashem and cry our 'ad mosai'. It was precious and we are very proud of the way the talmidim embraced this avodoh.

Cheder expectations are mandatory and leave little room for avodoh in the area of volition. However, parents have more opportunities to bring iskafya and kadesh atsmecho bemutor loch into the lives of the children and instill within them this core Chabad practice.
