In celebration of completion of our reader, the boys made a birthday party for Grandma, as in our story, "Are We There Yet?" They made a poster and birthday cake for grandma. (see pics) They were treated to a nosh bag, soda and ices. What a major bash!! In Math, Aaron Lewis, A.Y. Silverstein, and Mrs. Levin measured the floor using our feet and understood that it would not be exact for we each have different sizes. Using a ruler, we measured other objects and learned about inches, feet and yards. We introduced our unit on Colonial America. In the 1600s and 1700s, Europeans came to North America looking for religious freedom, economic opportunities and political liberty. They created 13 colonies on the East Coast of the continent. Later, when the colonists won independence, these colonies became the 13 original states. Looks like we are almost finished our Spelling and Handwriting books. Oh no!! Is the end of year near?? Can't think about that for now!! We cherish each day at Cheder!! Gut Shabbos!

This week we continued reviewing Multiplication and Division. Most of the boys have really become quite proficient. If your son is having difficulty keeping up, PLEASE review with him. We had a discussion about being mevater. In addition, we are catching up on our Grammar lessons. In Writing the boys wrote stories about a pet....hippopotamus!!! We enjoyed hearing everyone's stories. In Handwriting we have almost completed all the Upper and Lower case letters! The boys had to copy a Script paragraph describing how much they enjoy recess....and class 3A is definitely enjoying taking advantage of the beautiful weather! Have a guten Shabbos!

It's been a busy week in Third Grade. As we begin to look ahead to the end of the school year, we want to make sure we are properly prepared for Fourth Grade! We are therefore reviewing all that we have covered in math this year (such as multiplication, division) We played a fun game of bing<mark>o</mark> and it almost felt like a treat not a math lesson. Our 'Wordly Wise' vocabulary lesson sparked a heated discussion about the "vigorous" life of a firefighter. It is a very "risky" job and firefighter<mark>s</mark> can become quite "stressed". We learned why "prank" calls to firefighters and other emergency services are no joke. It is also a good idea to draw a "diagram" of your house so in an emergency, people can find the exits clearly and make their way out of the house quickly and safely. Did you hear? Our Third Grade class was invited on a trip to space. The weight limit is very calculated and the boys were challenged to write a paragraph about what they would bring along. This resulted in some very creative & entertaining articles. It was so impressive to see that the first things fo<mark>r</mark> most boys were their Siddur, Tanya and Tehillim- so that they can daven and keep up with their learning. This week we continued to review multiplication with fractions. Most of the students know the method but find the various steps of computation challenging. This skill sometimes involves two digit division when changing an improper fraction to a mixed numeral. We will continue to review. They also were introduced to the first step in dividing fractions. It is simply same process as multiplication but first requires using the reciprocal of the second number. We read an historical fiction story, Samuel's Choice, that takes place during the civil war. It's interesting to see how different a slave child's life was in that period. In Science we are gearing up to build our rockets It is fascinating to see how Newton's Three Laws of Motion pertain to every aspect of the rocket. We are almost finished our vocabulary book and started unit 15 this week. We are racing toward the finish line!
