We are looking forward to meeting you Monday night IYH. A schedule is attached for the slots for various classes. We aren't able to provide separate slots for each class. However, we divided the grades in a way that should make it possible for parents with more than one child in the cheder to meet two sets of Rebbies and teachers.

There will also be a meeting with the principals, who will discuss focus areas for this year and the planned special programs. It is our hope that you will partner with us and encourage your child to join the extracurricular programs. This is a great way to generate excitement and pique interest in learning and *darchei hachassidus*.

The mitzvos in this week's parshah are particularly focused on mitzvos that support vulnerable people, i.e. a person who forced to borrow money, a young couple in their first year of marriage, one who lost valuables, and many more.

The implications of this are obvious and certainly apply in the cheder setting. It is important for our children to recognize that a school setting may leave some children feeling vulnerable. Throughout the day a child may feel lost, hungry, anxious about a test, online in the bathroom, and other scenarios. We should strive to help them cope with the situation and support them.

Rebbies are always on the lookout for a child who may seem lost, but we can also help our children recognize that the Torah instructs us to seek out opportunities to help vulnerable people, and there are many chances of doing just that in cheder every day.
