LETTER FROM THE MENAHEL:

Dear Parents,

As shluchim from the world over gather to celebrate their *zechus* to be the Rebbe's global messengers, their children, too, participate in a program of their own, highlighting the *zechus* they have to grow up on shlichus and be part of the shluchim families.

Owe often speak to our children and students about the responsibility of being Yidden ad chssidim. It is obvious that this must be emphasized in a time when the host cultore focuses on rights we must remind our children that the Torah focuses on responsibility not rights and entitlement.




















GRADE 3 SCIENCE FAIR
